

ORDINANCE NO. 73-1

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING DOGS FROM RUNNING AT LARGE AND FURTHER REGULATING THE KEEPING OF ANIMALS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP AND ESTABLISHING PENALTIES FOR THE OWNERS OF SUCH ANIMALS WHO PERMIT SUCH VIOLATIONS.

It is hereby ordained and enacted by the Board of Supervisors of Silver Spring Township, Cumberland County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

SECTION 1

No person having in his control or custody a dog shall suffer or permit such dog to run at large in this Township and upon public streets or highways or upon lands of any person other than the person having the control and custody of such dog.

SECTION 2

No person who has in his control or custody any dog or other domestic or nondomesticated animal shall allow or permit such animal to make loud, harsh noises to the extent that it shall disturb or interfere with the peace, quiet, rest or sleep of other persons.

SECTION 3

No person having the control and custody of any dog or other domestic or nondomesticated animal shall allow such animal to befoul, defile or corrupt any public sidewalk, walkway or property of any other person.

SECTION 4


Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof in a summary proceeding before any district justice, Justice of the Peace or Magistrate, pay a fine of not less

than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) nor more than Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) together with the cost of prosecution for each and every offense, provided that each day's violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION 5


All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be, and the same hereby are, repealed.
